

PHOTODYNAMIC THERAPY (PDT) BLU-U® LIGHT

PRE-TREATMENT INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Patients that have a history of recurring cold sores (Herpes Simplex Virus) should take oral Valtrex 1gram tablets, two tablets, twelve hours apart, on the day of your photodynamic therapy (PDT) treatment.
- 2. Your doctor will prescribe a mild prescription topical cortisone cream to be used after treatment. Please have this filled at the pharmacy before the day of your treatment.
- 3. Make sure your skin is clean and free of all make-up, moisturizer, and sunscreen. You may wash this off at the office if you wish. Bring a hat, sunglasses, and/or scarf (or any sun protective clothing and accessories) with you to your appointment so that you may wear them following treatment.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON THE DAY OF YOUR TREATMENT:

- 1. Photographs may be taken before and after the treatment to help track your progress.
- 2. You must sign a consent form.
- 3. An acetone/ alcohol preparation is performed by the staff before the application of the. This will enhance the absorption of the Levulan or Ameluz and ensure a more even uptake.
- 4. The Levulan solution or Ameluz cream is applied to the entire area to be treated (i.e. face, hands, chest, etc.) by a staff member.
- 5. The area(s) to be treated will be placed under the BLU-U light for approximately 16 to 17 minutes (treatment time). There may be a tingling sensation during your treatment.
- 6. Once the treatment has finished, a staff member will apply sunscreen to all treated areas before you leave the office.

POST-TREATMENT INSTRUCTIONS:

- You MUST stay away from sunlight for 48 hours following your BLU-U light treatment. Sunscreens will not
 protect the treated areas from photosensitivity reactions caused by visible light.
- Utilize the mild topical cortisone cream if prescribed by your doctor as directed. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact our office.
